PASTOR'S MESSAGE NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER -2008

Dear friends.

We are beginning preparation for a season of Stewardship, Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. I wish all of you a joyous and blessed Christmas. I send my love to all of you and your family members. It has been my honor to serve you this year as your pastor. This year I would like to share my favorite Christmas story. It is called "The Shoemaker's Dream".

"Once there was a cobbler named Conrad, a godly man. One night Conrad had dreamed that the next day Christ was coming to his humble shop. He got up early the next morning and went to the woods to gather green boughs to decorate his shops so that it would be an appropriate place in which to receive so great a Guest.

He waited all morning, but the only thing happened was that an old man shuffled up, asking to rest. The cobbler saw that his shoes were worn through. "I'll give you a new pair" he said and put on the old man the sturdiest shoes in the shop before sending him on his way.

He waited through the afternoon and the only happening was that an old woman under a heavy load of branches came by. She was weary, and out of compassion Conrad brought her in and gave her some of the food he had prepared for the Christ Child. Refreshed, she finally went on her way.

Then, as night began to fall, there came into his shop a lost child, crying bitterly. Conrad was annoyed because it was necessary to leave his shop in order to take the child home for she lived on the opposite side of the city.

Returned, he was convinced that he had missed the Lord. Sadly he lived through the moments as he had imagined them: the knock, the call, the latch pulled up, the lighted face, the offered cup. He would have kissed the hands where the nails had been, washed the feet where the spikes had entered. There the Lord would have sat with him, would have broken bread.

Conrad cried, 'Why is it, Lord, that your feet delay? Have You forgotten that this was the day?' Then soft in the silence a voice he heard.

'Lift up your heart for I kept my word.
Three times I came to your friendly door;
Three times my shadow was on your floor.
I was the beggar with bruised feet;
I was the woman you gave to eat;
I was the child on the homeless street'."





THOUGHTS ON STEWARDSHIP

This year Messiah Church has had to cut its budget back due to declining revenues. All of this happened at the time of the stock market collapse and the worsening economy. Some important programs and expenditures had to be cut. We are, for example, not going to mail out the newsletter anymore to any but shut-ins. *The Saddlebags* will come out only four times per year. Copies will be available in the narthex for pick up or the newsletter can be emailed to you if you provide an updated email address. These cut-backs can be restored if the funding comes in again as it has done so plentifully these past eight years of my pastorate. We must pray for God to provide and pray for God to guide us in our giving. Let us also pray for new members.

A friend of mine named Keith Hill wrote something recently on giving:

"It is one thing to write my annual stewardship letter when every one is prospering. When real estate is rising, stocks are soaring, and we're all riding the up escalator, asking folks to think about how they give is one thing.

It is another thing altogether to write about stewardship when the escalator is going down. The market quaking events of the last three weeks put us all on a huge down escalator. As I write, we're all still wondering where the bottom will be.

Actually, though, this is not a bad time to be writing about stewardship. For the season of the down escalator clears our vision. When we talk about giving while on the up escalator, it's easy to imagine that giving is merely passing along some of our windfall to God. But in fact the Bible is plain that Christian giving is the radical act of giving God the first fruits, not the windfall. So when the escalator is going down, and we're not really certain what is next, first fruits giving is a huge act of trust. Giving should be an act of trust during prosperous times too, but on the up escalator we really don't see it.

We have a new theme here: Heart, Soul, Mind, and Strength. We are pondering what it means to give our all to God and the people He loves. I believe that we can do so during this down escalator season and surprisingly, maybe even better than when the escalator is going up?

God provides! God will provide for us. We've asked our various ministry teams to dream big what would you like to accomplish for the Lord in 2009 if the budget grows by 10%!

God provides. He will provide for each of us and our families. Thus I'm not shy about asking folks to give generously even during a down escalator season. God will show himself faithful as he provides, maybe not with luxuries, but certainly with faithful provision for our needs!*

Please ponder these thoughts. Please sign up to be part of our prayer vigil for God's provision of money and new members on Saturday, November 15 from 8:00 AM to 5:000 PM. The church will be open for prayer. You may also pray at home.

Fall Getaway



Athletes In Action

Athletes in Action started off with a bang this year. The first event that we organized was a paintball tournament that took place right outside of Stevens Point. It was the first time I ever got to shoot anybody with a paintball gun, pretty exhilirating stuff! It was also a good opportunity to share with some athletes about the weekly small group we have going on every Monday night. So far we have had about five meetings, with about 5 to 10 people coming every week. We have been alternating between Bible studies and sports labs, so that we can get a feel for what it looks like to incorporate our walk with the Lord into our sports. A few of the topics covered have been: playing for an "Audience of One", where we learned that the ultimate purpose of sports is to worship and glorify God, the "Inside Game", in which we discussed how our identity in Christ frees us to compete with a 'grace motivation', and "Holy Sweat", where we learned that maturity is a process of growing in grace and truth and that it takes time.

There are so many other stories I would love to share with you about what the Lord has been doing in my life and in the lives of men and women in Stevens Point. This has been one of the best falls of my life, because I have never felt so connected to the Lord and to others and I have never seen Him work in as many amazing ways as I have in the last few months. Dear members of Messiah United Methodist Church,

On Sunday, November 16 we shall observe Stewardship Sunday. In gratitude to God, we are called to be stewards or caretakers of what God has given us. We offer our time, talents, and financial resources up to the Lord! This year you will find an estimate of giving form at the bottom of this letter. Copies will also be distributed in the Sunday Bulletins. We would like you to complete this form because we feel that it is important to make a decision prayerfully as to how much you will give to God each week or month and set that money aside exclusively for God's use. We challenge each of you to reflect on the question, "What is God calling me to give as a percentage of my income?" The accompanying chart might help you in these calculations. Some may answer it by saying, "I feel God is calling me to give ten percent of my income to the Lord's work. I have been thinking about tithing for several years, and I want to begin that spiritual journey this year." Another kind of person responds to the question like this "Eventually, I want to begin tithing, but I am not ready to do that this year. I feel God is calling me to start somewhere—to drive my tent pegs in the ground at five percent or six percent—knowing that God will bless that decision by helping me to increase my giving in coming years." A third kind of person has been tithing for many years. For example, one couple said years ago when they were just getting started, "We'll tithe now; later we'll do more. After God has blessed us so abundantly we feel God is calling us to give fifteen percent to the Lord's work now."

The Stewardship Committee asks you to pray about your level of giving this year and consider filling in the estimate of giving form even if you have never done so in the past. This will be helpful to you as a record of the commitment God has called you to make, and it will help the church as it sees what funds are available for our budget for 2009 in the amount of \$115,437. Rising fuel bills and inflation have increased our annual budget by \$2,829 which is necessary for carrying out the mission of our local church and its local, national and international outreach.

We ask you to come and hear Mary Buzby, one of our lay speakers, preach on Stewardship, Sunday, November 16. After hearing the sermon, we would like you to fill out your estimate of giving form, place it in a sealed envelope, and come and place it in the offering plate on Sunday, November 23 or Sunday, November 30. If you cannot be in church on either Sunday, please mail it the week of December 1 to Messiah Church, Steve Koeppen, Financial Secretary, 25 Middle Street, Taneytown, MD 21787. These forms will be reviewed only by Steve.

We also are asking every one to be part of a prayer vigil for our church on Saturday, November 15 from 8:00 AM until 6:00 PM praying, in our homes or at church, that God would bring in the necessary funds for our church's budget and that God would bring us the people with the spiritual gifts and talents that can help build up the body of Christ here. If you can sign up to pray for a half-hour period, please contact Ed Miller at 410-756-9638. God bless you as you pray.





- Bibles (optional).


What you do:

PIN THE STAR ON THE MANGER


What you need:


